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

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




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Percent of All Hospitalizations for Seniors that were Related to an Unintentional Fall, 2007/08



Fall Related Hospitalizations in Seniors by Injury Place, Atlantic Canada 2007-08




Percent of Hospitalizations due to unintentional falls, specified cause of injury Atlantic Canada 2007-2008

Percent of All Hip Fractures in Seniors Involving a Fall Related Hospitalization in 2007/08





Cost of Hip Surgery




Average Estimated Cost by Case Mix type 2008


Average Seniors Length of Stay for Fall Related Hospitalizations versus All Other Hospitalizations in 2007/08





hospitalized with a fall related injury in Atlantic Canada, fell at home. Seniors admitted to hospital as a result of falling, on average their Length of Stay was 6 days longer than Seniors hospitalized without a fall event 1 in 5 nonresidential care patients in Atlantic Canada were transferred into a residential care facility after being hospitalized for a fall

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
