
"Alcohol involvement in injuries has been demonstrated in numerous studies.

Hundreds of thousands of deaths occur each year due to alcohol-related intentional and unintentional injuries, and alcohol is involved in up to 30% of adult hospital admissions, particularly those to emergency rooms."



"Adolescent alcohol use plays a substantial role in all three leading causes of death among youth -- unintentional injuries (including motor vehicle fatalities and drownings), suicides, and homicide, and is also associated with risky sexual behavior and addiction."




Molson Coors Canada makes a substantial donation to the "Save the Oval" campaign




