Health & Safety Awareness Survey 2017

WorkplaceNL

About the Survey

- The purpose of the survey was to gain a better understanding of health and safety awareness among employers and workers in NL.
- Individuals over 15 years of age were eligible to participate.
- Captured three important aspects of health and safety awareness:
 - Knowledge about workers' rights, roles, and responsibilities in the workplace.
 - Participation in decisions that impact workers' health and safety while at work.
 - Empowerment to act if a worker encounters an unsafe act or condition at work.

Conducting the Survey: Methodology

- The survey was completed by the NL Statistics Agency and took place between January 13, 2017 and May 8, 2017.
- The survey was conducted using a Simple Random Sample stratified by geography, gender, and age group to ensure an even proportional distribution.

Who completed the survey?

- A total of 721 workers completed the telephone survey.
- Respondents ≥ 25 years of age were twice as likely to be employed full-time than those ≤ 25 years of age. This indicates that a large proportion of young workers were likely students.
- Respondents ≥ 25 years of age had more work experience as evidenced by the higher proportion in supervisor and management roles.
- The majority of both groups were employed in the service industry which also accounts for the highest numbers of employment and injuries in each age group.

Health & Safety Awareness (HSA) Index


- The HSA Index was created to summarize the results of the survey.
 - Calculated from 18 questions from the survey chosen to represent knowledge, participation, and empowerment.
 - Will be calculated in each future iteration of the survey as an indicator of change in overall health and safety awareness.

Health & Safety Awareness (HSA) Index

 In 2017, 88.2 per cent of the workforce had a "high" or "very high" awareness of health and safety.



HSA Index: Overall Index Results




88.2 per cent of the workforce has a "high" or "very high" awareness of health and safety.

HSA Index: Overall Index Results for Young Workers



87.1 per cent of young workers have a "high" or "very high" awareness of health and safety.

HSA Index: Overall Index Results for Workers ≥ 25 years of age



88.3% of the workforce ≥ 25 years of age has a "high" or "very high" awareness of health and safety.

Knowledge

- The survey identified that there is a high level of knowledge of health and safety in the workforce.
- Identified that a lot of the knowledge acquired by young workers is a result of the OHS 3203 high school course.
- Young workers have a lot of knowledge of health and safety but may not be as engaged as workers ≥ 25 years of age.

Knowledge

 Identified that more employers should be aware of the importance of offering safety training to workers prior to starting work or within the first week of work.

 Questions regarding employers views of health and safety highlighted the fact that 8 per cent of employers account for all of the claims received.

Participation & Empowerment

 Respondents had a high level of knowledge and believed that they could and would act if they observed a health and safety hazard or issue at work.

 However, only 54 per cent of respondents had ever reported a health and safety hazard or issue to their employer.

Participation & Empowerment

- Young workers were more empowered to bring a health and safety hazard or issue to their employers attention if they did identify one while at work.
- Respondents ≥ 25 years of age reported being more comfortable bringing health and safety hazards or issues to the attention of their coworkers than to the attention of their employers.

Participation & Empowerment

- Respondents believed that their coworkers had an awareness of health and safety hazards or issues in the workplace and were committed to working safely. This reinforces the presence of a strong safety culture in the workplace.
- 10 per cent of respondents reported that their employer did **not** involve them in decisions affecting workplace health and safety and that there was **no cooperation** between management and workers to ensure the safest possible conditions in the workplace.

Action To Date

- Current injury prevention programs, initiatives, and services are being updated to reflect awareness gaps.
- New Prevention Strategy has incorporated results of the OHS Awareness Survey and will strategically address gaps in education and awareness.
- Changes to OHS Awareness Survey for 2018

Summary

Survey targeted two age groups

- OHS awareness is higher than expected, especially in young workers
- Actions have been taken to address gaps
- OHS Awareness survey updated for 2018
